



Overview

O'More recognizes that a student's potential as a designer may not be fully represented by a GPA or conventional academic measures. Three brief submittal requirements allow Interior Design applicants to demonstrate creative abilities, passion, and other attributes that are important for aspiring designers.

Project 1: Sketching or Photography

Find a building or space that you appreciate. Then, either create several sketches of the space, paying attention to details and proportions, or take several photos that capture the elements of the space that you find most inspiring.

Project 2: Materials Board

Create a composition on a board (e.g., matboard or foam core board) displaying a variety of materials—paint, fabric, images of furnishings, tile, etc.—intended for a room or space that you envision.

Project 3: Essay Question

Designers are inspired by a variety of buildings and spaces. What skills or ideas do you look forward to developing at O'More that will prepare you to design spaces that inspire others?

Responses should be a minimum of one page.

For convenience's sake, substitutions of alternate work that that demonstrates design passion and awareness may be allowed. Note: Application submittals may also count toward submittal requirements for potential departmental scholarship awards. (For more information, ask admissions representatives about Interior Design Scholarships.)

Applicants should submit their work to the O'More Office of Admissions (meldabbs@omorecollege.edu or mail to 423 South Margin Street, Franklin, TN 37064) for the review of the Interior Design Department Chair or a designee.

All submitted work should be labeled with the applicant's name and should be received no later than December 1 for the spring semester or May 31 for the fall semester for priority admission. Within two weeks of submittal, and usually after only a few days, the applicant will be notified whether or not his/her application is successful.
