

Articulation Agreement between
COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE
and
O'More College of Design

Introduction

This Articulation Agreement formally recognizes that COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE and O'More College of Design are active educational partners, committed to providing greater educational opportunities and services for students transitioning between institutions. This agreement is crafted to make the transfer process between institutions simple and fair without question on credits earned.

In cooperation between COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE and O'More College of Design, both institutions recognize the work the students have achieved in their careers in higher education.

Purpose

This agreement is designed to aid in the transition of COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE students who transfer to O'More College of Design to bring with them the credit they have already earned for as much relevant study as possible. The articulation agreement provides an outline of all courses earned at COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE and the equivalent courses at O'More College of Design.

Transfer Elements

COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE Associate Degrees and General Education Courses

This articulation agreement sets the definition for both holders of Associates degrees from COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE and students who have taken courses in General Education.

Students who have received an Associate's degree from COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE will have all General Education Core courses satisfied at O'More College of Design.

Students who have taken General Education courses at COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE will have the corresponding course transferred to O'More College of Design as long as the grade earned is a C or above. Refer to the General Education chart for course equivalencies.

Admission to O'More College of Design

COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE transfer students must go through O'More College of Design's application process and therefore must meet all applicable requirements and deadlines pertaining to submitting all college transcripts, application for admission, orientation and registration, and payment of tuition and fees. They will abide by the policies and procedures, along with any revisions thereof that apply to all students from that institution.

Obligations of the Institutions

COLUMBIA STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE and O'More College of Design agree to provide direct links between their institutional Web sites, indicating the existence of this Agreement.

Both institutions may request, in writing, information regarding FERPA compliant directory information. This directory should include name, address, telephone, city, zip code, email address, and major.

Notice of Nondiscrimination

The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11,246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the related regulations to each. Each party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual including, but not limited to, employees or applicants for employment and/or students because of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity / expression, disability, age, status as a protected veteran, genetic information, or any other legally protected class with respect to all employment, programs and activities.

The parties also agree to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during their employment without regard to their race, color, religion, creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity / expression, disability, age, status as a protected veteran, genetic information, or any other legally protected class. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection available to employees and applicants for employment to the extent that such laws are applicable to each party individually.

Evaluation

There will be an annual evaluation process of the partnership supported by this articulation agreement. The information obtained from this evaluation will be used to improve the transfer process for the benefit of students. The process will also re-evaluate course listing and new course offerings.

Longevity of the Agreement

This agreement will remain in effect for 5 years after the signature date. Renewal of the agreement after the 5 year period may be considered by resubmitting a new agreement after courses and conditions are re-evaluated by both institutions.


Either institution may discontinue this agreement by submitting a written notification to the other institution one year prior to cancellation. Upon receipt of the cancellation notice, both institutions will meet to discuss terms of cancellation and to ensure the students who are part of the agreement are not affected by the cancellation.

Confidentiality of Records

All educational records created, disclosed, or maintained pursuant to the terms of this Agreement are confidential and shall be created, disclosed, and maintained pursuant to the provisions of Family Educational Right to Privacy Act, also known as FERPA (20 U.S.C.A. s1232g) and its regulations.


